



FROM PASTOR RYAN BEAVERS

My family and I have been looking forward to our first holiday season in Dan-ville—decorating a new home, discovering new traditions and events in our town, and celebrating with our new church family. You'll soon receive all the details for Advent and Christmas through announcements, emails, and a short video, and I hope you'll join us whenever you can.

Because this is a two-month issue, I want to use this space to look ahead to the New Year. While I'm still new, one theme has been clearly on my heart for 2026: **the Word.** I'd love for this next year to be a season of intentionally engaging Scripture—both personally and together as a church.

We'll start the year with a six-week sermon series called "Long Story Short," beginning Sunday, January 11. We'll look at the Bible as one story told in six movements, helping us see how the whole narrative fits together.



That same week, we'll relaunch our Wednesday study, now called "Bible

Unpacked," beginning January 14. These sessions will move through Scripture slowly and thoughtfully—exploring context, history, and literary details. We'll offer an 11:00am morning session and an evening gathering with dinner at 5:45pm and study at 6:30pm.



Friends, somehow we've made it to December.

I don't know how that happened, because it feels like I was just dodging golf balls at River District Social last week, but here we are. Advent is here, Christmas is on the horizon, and Fairview is already buzzing in the best kind of way.

This time of year always makes me slow down a bit and look around at what God is doing, and I can honestly say He has been so good to us. Our ROOTS Youth Group has averaged around fourteen teens every Sunday night, and a few weeks ago we even hit sixteen. Sixteen teenagers... on a Sunday night... opening their Bibles and leaning in. That alone is enough to make a youth director tear up. These kids aren't just showing up to hang out. They're coming hungry for the Word and hungry for community.

We also had a Youth Council meeting with parents, leaders, and helpers, and it was one of the most encouraging meetings I've been part of. We talked through some upcoming changes for 2026 that we believe will serve our families really well. Starting in January 2026, our Sunday evening youth group will shift to meeting from 4pm to 6pm. This gets everyone home earlier on a school night and pulls us out of that crowded 5pm to 7pm suppertime window.

With that shift comes another change. For the past couple years we've provided full meals every Sunday night, and those meals have been such a blessing. The fellowship around the table has been one of my favorite parts of ROOTS. But planning and providing those meals every single week takes a lot of time, money, and effort. So beginning in 2026, we won't have weekly meals anymore. However, we *will* still do meals occasionally for special events and bigger nights. We're not saying goodbye to food forever. We're just being wise with our time so we can focus on games, small groups, and most importantly, more time in Scripture.

Something else I'm excited about is the return of Wednesday night Bible study for the adults in 2026. When Pastor Ryan shared that vision, Amy and myself knew immediately we needed something for our teens as well. So ROOTS will add a Wednesday night connection for them too. One night each week where the whole church family is under the same roof growing together. I love that.

Now, I have to brag on our teens for a minute. This past year, they have shown up for this church in ways that have blown me away. Every single event we've had... they've been there. Helping, volunteering, serving, and smiling wherever needed. They have taken ownership of being a part of Fairview, and that is one of the most encouraging things I've witnessed since becoming their youth director. These aren't kids who sit on the sidelines. They serve like they belong here, because they do. And they make us proud.

And then there's the #PewCrew. If you haven't heard that phrase floating around yet, that's what we call our teens sitting together on Sunday mornings in worship. They've started gathering together in one section of the sanctuary, worshiping as a group, singing, paying attention, and being part of the service in a real way. To look out and see a whole row of teenagers worshiping together... I can't explain how much that encourages me. That's what a healthy church looks like. That's what the future looks like.

Now for something a little more immediate. On December 19 we're having a youth lock in. This will double as our Christmas party, and we would welcome any snacks or baked goodies you want to send our way. And if anyone feels brave enough to stay up all night with sixteen teenagers, just let me know. I'll buy you coffee. A lot of it.

Through all of this, I continue to be so thankful for the helpers, parents, staff, and church members who make this ministry possible. Your support is felt every single week. You have cooked, you have shown up, you pray, you encourage, and you make Fairview the kind of place where teenagers actually want to be. That's a gift.

But more than anything, I'm thankful for our teens. They make me proud every single week. I see real faith taking root in them. I see them asking questions, serving, caring for each other, and growing in ways that only God can do. Watching that happen has been one of the greatest joys of my ministry.

As we step into this Advent season, my prayer is simple. That in the middle of the lights, the music, the schedules, and the noise, we will make room in our hearts for Jesus. He really did step into our world on purpose and for a purpose. And that truth still changes lives.


READING NOOK
