On Monday evening, October 20, the Administrative Council at Fairview made a decision regarding our Sunday morning worship schedule moving forward. It was decided that our new Worship Times would be:

9:00am- Traditional Service 10:30am- Contemporary Service

Upon announcing this news I mentioned that a full discussion was had and we arrived at this decision for a few reasons. A significant factor was that we wanted to make sure we were offering enough time in the morning for those with children to be up and ready to make it in time for a late morning service.

While we always want to be <u>looking after</u> those that God has already blessed us with, we must never neglect our calling to be <u>looking out</u> for those who are not here yet.

A few weeks ago, somewhat in preparation for this decision, I preached out Acts 15. It was a story about how the church chose to do something radically different for the sake of reaching new people.

Acts 10:33

"Now we are all here, waiting before God to hear the message the Lord has given you."

It's that rare time when phones are put away, conversation flows, and we get to simply share life around a table. It takes a lot of food to feed this crew, and so many of you have stepped up to make that possible. You're not just feeding hungry teens, you're helping build community and show the love of Christ one plate at a time.

And I can't leave out how thankful I am for our amazing teens in ROOTS. We've seen so much growth this year, not just in numbers but in hearts. These teens are seeking the Lord in real ways. They're asking hard questions, digging into Scripture, and showing up ready to learn. It's not just about games and food anymore (although let's be honest, the food still helps). It's about watching them grow in their relationship with Christ and with one another. I've seen quiet kids open up in prayer, new friendships form, and genuine faith take root. It's one of the greatest blessings of my ministry, and I'll cherish it forever. If joy had a face, it would probably be a teen with a plate of pizza in one hand and a Bible in the other.

Most of all, I'm thankful for the Lord, His goodness, and His mercy. Psalm 100:4–5 says, "Enter his gates with thanksgiving; go into his courts with praise. Give thanks to him and praise his name. For the Lord is good. His unfailing love continues forever, and his faithfulness continues to each generation" (NLT).

That's the heartbeat of this season. God has been faithful to Fairview through every change and challenge, and He's not done yet. So as you sit around the table this Thanksgiving, between the turkey and the pie, and somewhere between the family stories you've all heard a hundred times, take a minute to smile and thank God for the people around your table. Because the moment we start counting blessings, we realize we've lost track of how many there are.


Kids!

TRUSTEES UPDATE

The trustees have been busy. We had a major room reshuffle in the Sunday School wing. Both the children and youth need more room, what a wonderful "problem" to have. The J.U.M.P. room is now next to BKK where the Koinonia Class had been. The Koinonia Class is now where the Grace Seekers Class had been. The Youth are expanding into where the Closet of Blessings Clothes Closet had been and into the end room which had been for college students as well as the Makers' group for a short while. The previous clothes Closet and college room are now combined into 1 large room.

This moving involved not only the moving but also preparing the rooms for the new users. The new youth room, ROOTs, is now one large room and the new J.U.M.P. room is now more child friendly. New flooring, painting, light fixtures, and patching holes in the walls and ceilings left over from obsolete equipment which was removed is now almost completed in both newly renovated rooms. The ceiling over the back storage room in the pavilion also had to be put in so the building could be insulated. We were fortunate to have the Scouts planning and doing this construction, painting, etc. as an Eagle project for Jackson Wethington. Thank you, Jackson and Scouts for planning and doing so much of the work.

Trustees have also been busy doing normal maintenance such as scraping and painting the two rooms off either side of the chancel. As well as repairing or replacing such items as doors, transition strips, ceiling repairs, door handles, splash guards, counter tops, and arranging fall lawn maintenance.

Both the new ROOTs and JUMP rooms are almost finished. We are sorry that there was a mess for so long and we appreciate your patience.
